

GUIDELINES FOR EXTENSION OF PREMISES TO PATIO/OUTDOOR AREAS

- ▶ 1. Alcohol cannot be served outside unless an application to extend the licensed premises has been approved
- ▶ 2. An application to extend the premises must describe the area in detail, including seating capacity
- ▶ 3. The premises must be enclosed by a fence, rope or other means to prevent access from a public walkway
- ▶ 4. The outdoor area must be contiguous to the licensed premises
- ▶ 5. The applicant must have a lease or permission to occupy the proposed area
- ▶ 6. The licensing authority should consider noise in the area
- ▶ 7. For outdoor areas where alcohol will be served, it is preferred if seating is available and food is served

REOPENING OVERVIEW

- The following detailed commentary is related to the Executive Orders signed by Governor Baker on May 18, 2020, and June 1, 2020.
 - This document is intended to provide additional information on businesses and activities summarized in the Reopening Massachusetts report.
 - This is not an exhaustive list of all possible businesses that will be authorized open in each phase. The list may be updated from time to time.

PHASE 1 SUMMARY

MAY 18, 2020

- ▶ Essential businesses already open (must self-certify)
- ▶ Manufacturing
- ▶ Construction
- ▶ Retail curbside pickup only
- ▶ Places of worship (40% occupancy)
- ▶ Firearms retailers, shooting ranges

MAY 25, 2020

- ▶ Laboratories and life science facilities
- ▶ Offices (25% capacity)
- ▶ Car washes (exterior/self serve)
- ▶ Hair salons/barbershops (appointments only)
- ▶ Pet grooming by appointment (curbside drop off and pickup)
- ▶ Certain Outdoor Recreational facilities and activities

PHASE 2 SUMMARY- BUSINESSES

- ▶ Retail Stores – including stores in enclosed malls
- ▶ Restaurants – continue with takeout/delivery; Phase 2 adds outdoor seating initially; indoor seating later in Phase 2
- ▶ Hotels, motels and inns (no events, functions or meetings)
- ▶ Limited organized youth and adult sports – no contact and no games or scrimmages; indoor facilities limited to youth programs
- ▶ Personal Services –
 - ▶ Step 1: Services involving no close personal contact (photography, window washers, individual tutoring, home cleaning, etc.)
 - ▶ Step 2: Services involving close personal contact (massage, nail salons, personal training for individuals or no more than 2 persons from family)
- ▶ Driving schools
- ▶ Funeral homes – increased capacity to permit 40% occupancy

PHASE 2 SUMMARY- BUSINESSES

- ▶ Warehouses and distribution centers
- ▶ Golf facilities including outdoor driving ranges
- ▶ Other outdoor recreational facilities
 - ▶ Outdoor pools, playgrounds and spray decks
 - ▶ Mini golf, go karts, batting cages, climbing walls, ropes courses
- ▶ Post-Secondary/Higher Ed/VoTech/Trade/Occupational Schools
 - ▶ For the limited purposes of permitting students to complete degrees for employment
- ▶ Day camps, including sports and arts camps
- ▶ Public libraries

PHASE 2 REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ Phase 2 enterprises may not open their premises to customers and the public until authorized to do so by subsequent order
- ▶ Effective immediately, all Phase 2 business owners can enter enterprises to begin preparing for re-opening:
 - ▶ Complete a COVID-19 Control Plan (self-certification)
 - ▶ Implement sector-specific protocols
 - ▶ Comply with Mandatory Workplace Safety Standards

PHASE 2 OUTDOOR RECREATION

- ▶ Specific Phase 2 guidance to be released soon
- ▶ Programs for **contact** sports must limit activities to no-contact drills and practices (basketball, lacrosse, baseball)
- ▶ Programs for **no contact** sports where ordinary play allows for social distancing may include ordinary play
- ▶ Games, scrimmages and tournaments shall not be permitted for any organized sports activities
- ▶ Programs must separate participants into groups no more than 10 participants including coaches and staff
- ▶ Indoor athletic facilities shall be open and available for youth only, including sports camps
